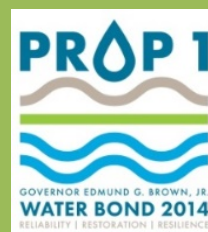

Three Creeks Parkway Restoration Project

Grantee : American Rivers

Project Type: Implementation

Conservancy Funding: \$836,409

Project Number: 2015-09

Project Description

- A multi-benefit ecosystem restoration project at the confluence of Marsh, Sand, and Deer Creeks (three creeks) to convert a denuded flood control channel into a healthy riparian corridor.
- Will restore native vegetation and create floodplain and riparian habitat on 12.5 acres along nearly a mile of Marsh Creek.
- The overall goals are to improve habitat, connectivity, flood management, water quality, and ecosystem resilience in the Marsh Creek watershed from Mount Diablo to the Delta.
- The project has the support of several groups including Contra Costa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District, the Friends of Marsh Creek Watershed, and the City of Brentwood.

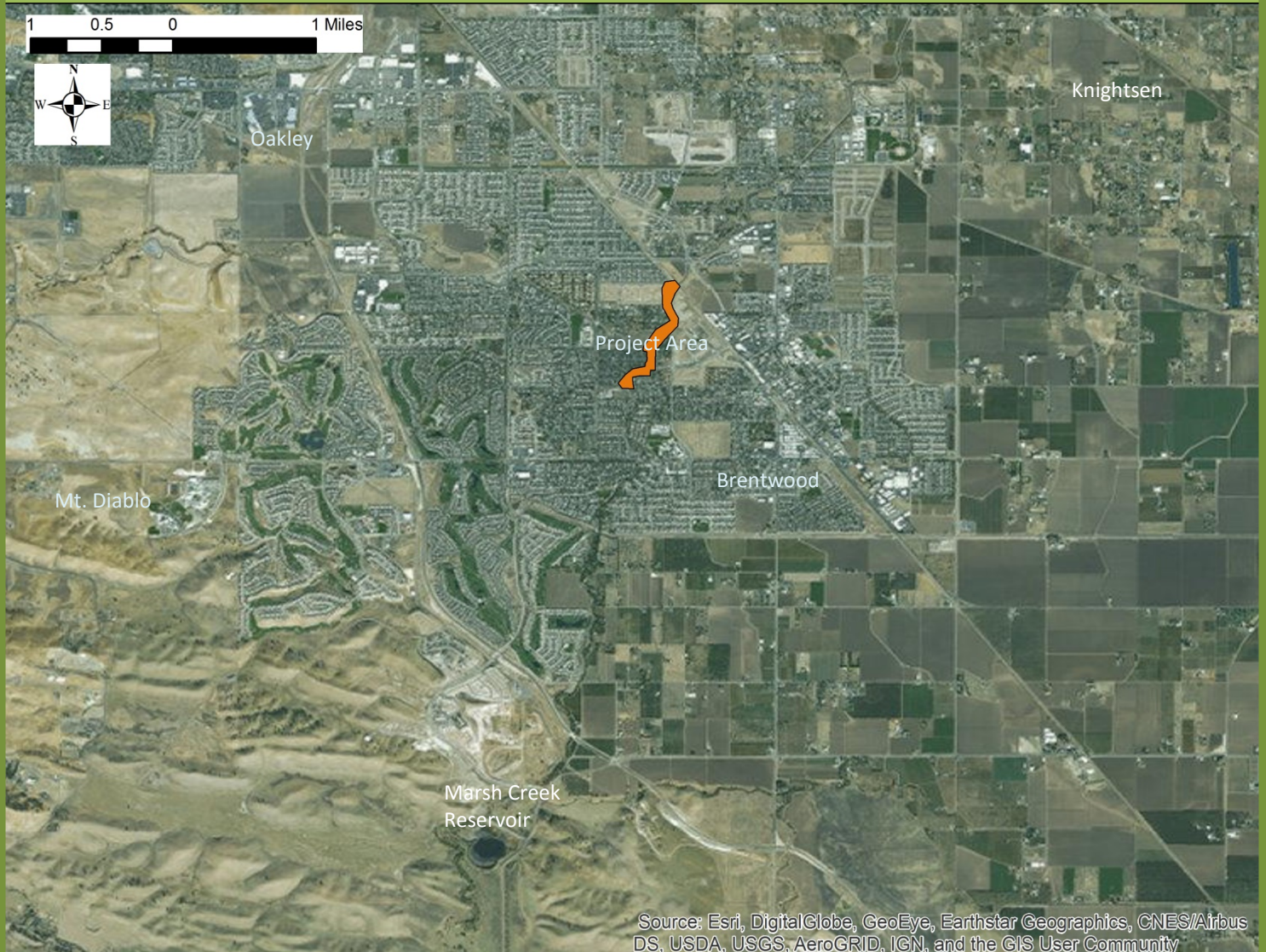

Timeline

- Project Start Date – May 1, 2017
- Construction – Early Fall 2017
- Revegetation – Late Fall 2017
- Monitoring – Seasonally until Spring 2020



Location

The project site is located along the stretch of Marsh Creek that runs between Dainty Ave. and the Union Pacific Railway crossing in Brentwood, Contra Costa County, and includes the confluences of Marsh, Sand and Deer Creeks.
